
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Capacity Beds Operational Beds

Saved a child suffering with multiple organ failure from neck infection

- A 1-year-old, initially diagnosed with croup (upper airway obstruction), deteriorated rapidly with signs of impending respiratory failure and Toxic Shock Syndrome.
- The child had multiorgan dysfunction needed aggressive treatment including IVIG, broad-spectrum antibiotics, dialysis, therapeutic plasma exchange, and tracheostomy.
- After a prolonged hospital stay, the child was discharged following successful treatment and management of this complex condition.
- We managed to save this child because of multidisciplinary pediatric intensive care services and latest medical interventions








Seizures versus Arrythmia - mystery solved by ECG & Genetics



- 15 year old child presented with generalized seizure disorder from 3 years of age. History of hearing loss (moderate) present.
- Multiple Neuroimaging and EEGs for past 12 years were normal.
- On evaluation, clinically bradycardia (low heart rate) was present with normal heart sounds. ECHO revealed normal heart but ECG showed prolonged QTC. (560 msec with heart rate of 60 per minute)
- Considering the clinical scenario, the child was treated with Bblockers and mexiletine and genetics test for Long QT were sent for evaluation
- The child recovered with the medication and the seizures stopped. Genetics test came positive for Jervell and Lange-Nielsen syndrome [KCNQI positive].
- Importance of this case is the seizure like episodes could be arrhythmia [Torsade's] and hearing loss is a clue.
- Picking up these disorders early is better as we can avoid sudden cardiac deaths.


Multidisciplinary Management of Complex Pregnancy



- A 32-year-old primigravida with a complex medical history, including nephrotic syndrome, chronic hypertension, type 2 diabetes mellitus, and a history of ischemic heart disease, underwent angioplasty in 2018. Despite medical advice against pregnancy, she conceived unintentionally.
- After seeking a second opinion, her renal, cardiac, and diabetic statuses were stable, allowing for continued pregnancy with close multidisciplinary monitoring.
- Throughout the antenatal period, her health and fetal growth were closely monitored, identifying fetal growth restriction and superimposed gestational hypertension.
- Elective cesarean delivery was performed at 38 weeks. Epidural anesthesia was administered considering her cardiac condition, with post operative care including prophylactic antibiotics and antithrombotic measures.
- The patient was discharged after 48 hours, highlighting the effectiveness of a multidisciplinary approach in achieving favorable maternal and perinatal outcomes despite complex medical conditions during pregnancy.

Stroke in a child with Congenital Heart Disease – urgent thrombolysis saves life

- 15 year child presented with Congenital Heart disease (DORV / TGA: not corrected)
- The child was admitted for syncope like episode followed by mild encephalopathy. For 12 hours in hospital the child remained fine
- The child suddenly developed aphasia and left hemiparesis while being in hospital
- Urgent CT angiogram performed which showed evidence of blood clot
- Multidisciplinary team including Cardiologist, Neuro surgeon, Neurologist and Intensivist intervened immediately
- Thrombolysis was started immediately to dissolve the blood clot (Altaplase 0.9 mg/kg)
- Post thrombolysis the child recovered well with neurology impairment normalized and discharges without any complication.











>100 Seizures per day- Treated with Epilepsy surgery

- 7 year old child had recurrent seizures for 15 months because of congenital stroke
- The child was tried on 6 different medications without success and was currently on 3 different antiseizure medications and still having multiple seizures.
- Since last 4 months the seizure frequency increased to more than 100 seizures in a day. Seizure burden was so much so that the child had completely lost the development milestones.
- The was seen by team of epileptologist and epilepsy surgeon at Rainbow Hospital. The team felt that stroke which the child had during early childhood caused to have such a bad epilepsy
- The child would be an ideal patient for a brain surgery to control epilepsy called, Hemispherectomy. After surgery the child came for 3 months follow up
- The child does not have any seizures now and started speaking normally. The cognition is back and the child started going to school.
- Weakness is recovering with regular physiotherapy.
- Parents were extremely happy regarding outcome
